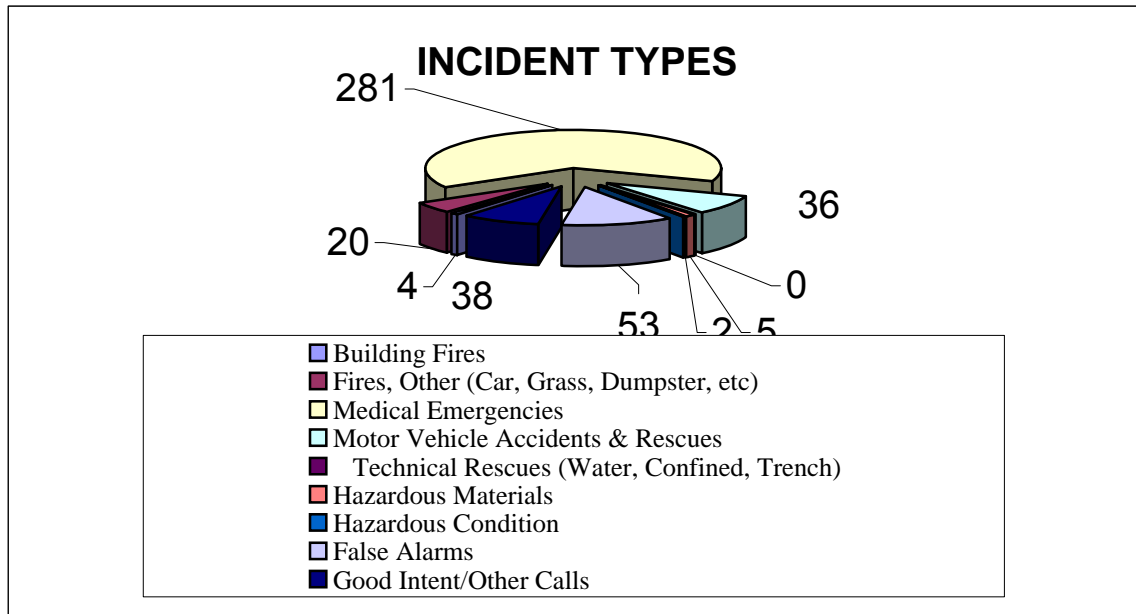

CALLS OF SIGNIFICANCE

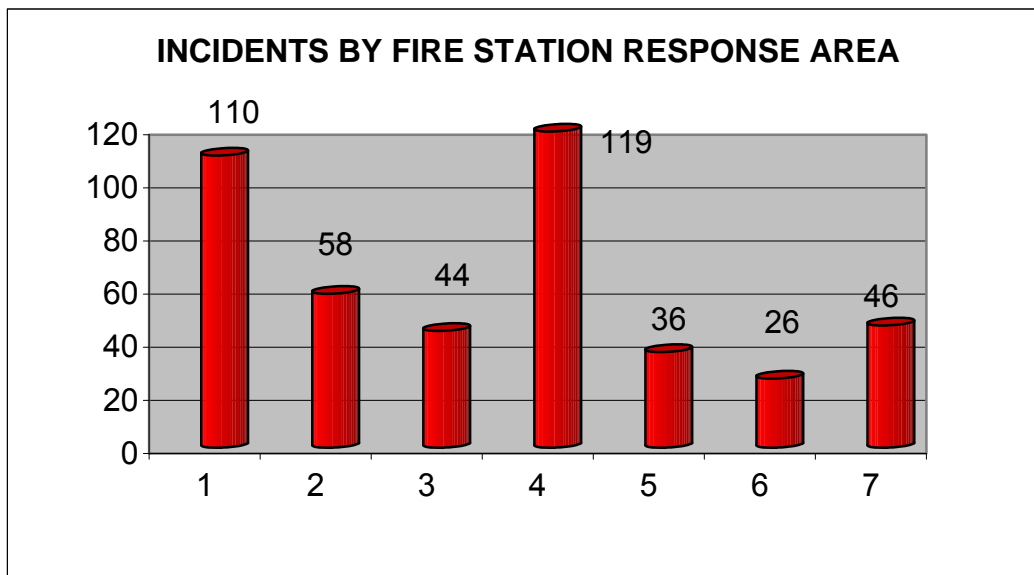
- Aug 4 - Numerous grass fires along I-540 between Walnut Street and Pleasant Grove Road
